UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Underground Railroad Tour, Ottawa Date: Wednesday April 3, 2024 Deadline: Friday, March 1, 2024

Cost \$80 M/\$88 NM 7:30am - 4:00pm Medium Walking

Explore Ottawa's rich history of the Underground Railroad on this fascinating tour. A tour guide will join us on the bus as we discover how Ottawa played a crucial role in helping possibly thousands of slaves find their way to freedom in Canada through this network of secret routes and safe houses.

Learn about the ingenious use of the Illinois & Michigan Canal in transporting slaves and the dangerous journeys they made on foot by the cover of night. You will also delve into the only pre-Civil War court documentation of a trial regarding the Fugitive Slave Law, the Federal Court Case of John Hossack & James and Joseph Stout. You will also hear about the local Sundown Towns and Ottawa's inclusion in The Green Book, the African American Travel Book. Meet former slaves who risked everything to escape the tyranny of slavery and chose to make Ottawa their home. This insightful tour lasts approximately 2 hours. Lunch at Red Dog Grill is included. Meal choices will be chosen at a later date.



Old Joliet Prison Tour and Lunch Date: Tuesday April 16, 2024 Deadline: Friday, March 8, 2024

This is a 90-minute walking tour of the Old Joliet Prison led by docents and trained tour guides from the Joliet Area Historical Museum. This tour talks about the general history of the site from when it was first opened in 1858 till its closure in 2002. This historic tour is a great introduction to the Prison and its history. This tour takes you into the East and West Cell Houses, North Segregation, Cafeteria (inmate dining room) and the Chapel. Lunch will be on your own at Joliet Route 66 Diner after the Old Joliet Prison tour.

LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program)

We are accepting applications for the LIHEAP Program this fall. This program assists with gas and electric costs. LIHEAP will provide a one-time benefit to eligible households to be used for energy bills. The amount of payment is determined by income, household size, fuel type, and geographic locations. You will need to provide proof of income for all the household members, as well as your most current gas and electric bills and social security cards if you are a first-time applicant.

The program will continue thru August or until funds are depleted. 1 person household income limit \$2430.00/month 2 person household income limit \$3287.00/month

New to Medicare? We can help.



Our Social Services staff and SHIP volunteers are knowledgeable and helpful when it comes to all of your Medicare questions. We can assist you with enrollment, supplements, Part D, Advantage Plan questions, Prescription drug assistance, Medicare Savings Programs, Medicare & Medicaid Alignment Initiative & more. This service is available to people of all ages with Medicare.
 We are not affiliated with any insurance companies, we do not sell or solicit any type of insurance, and are trained by the Illinois Department on Aging. This service is offered FREE to people with Medicare and their caregivers.



Supplement Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Do you qualify for assistance that pays for groceries?

The SNAP program provides a monthly benefit that can be used to supplement your food budget. This benefit can allow you to have more money to use towards medical, housing, or prescription costs. Our Social Services staff can assist you with the application for this program through the Department of Human Services. For those 60 and older or who are disabled, the income guidelines are: \$2265.00/month for a single person \$3052.00/month for a 2 person household

Benefits Access Program Application Assistance



This program provides a license plate sticker discount as well as a Senior Ride Free Pass for Pace and Metra to those that qualify. The annual income eligibility guidelines for this program are: 1 person household - \$33,562 / 2 person household - \$44,533 This program provides benefits for 2 years and approval can take up to 12 weeks. Your sticker will cost only **\$10**. You will need 2022 tax returns.
